

NotM & Swarland Parish Council - December / January

Parish Council Report

There was no meeting in December. The Parish Council (PC) met on Wednesday 25th January 2017 in Swarland Village Hall. The next meeting of the PC will be in the Jubilee Hall, Newton on the Moor on 22nd February at 7pm.

Parish Council Budget

Our mid-year review of our 2016 / 17 finances suggests that we will break even at the year-end. We have agreed to establish a fund to support future improvement projects to the three community buildings in the parish (two village halls and Vyner Park pavilion). Following consultation over next year's budget (2017 / 18) we have agreed to increase our annual support to the two village halls, and to support a review of the parish plan and (if needed) the new local heritage project. We're increasing our precept by 5.6% to £19,000.

Parish Litter-Pick

All volunteers are invited to join us for the annual litter pick, which will take place on **Sunday 19th March**. Please assemble at **Swarland Square at 10am**, wearing suitable and visible outdoor clothing. Plastic bags, picker tools and disposable gloves will be provided. The litter-pick will cover the two villages and the roads between, but it can be extended to new areas if there are sufficient volunteers. The contact person is Greg Anderson (contact details are the same as for Jan, below).

Boundary Review

Following consultation with local residents last year, the PC asked Northumberland County Council (NCC) to review and change the parish boundary to include the area to the west of the A1 and also north of Learnington Lane, Swarland - currently within Felton Parish. NCC carried out the formal consultation but following strong objections from Felton Parish Council, has decided that there should be no change.

Affordable Housing

Our parish plan identified a need for low-cost rentable housing in the parish. Currently, there is no such provision. NCC's preference for further up-market housing in Swarland suggests it is unaware of our particular housing needs. We are therefore arranging to explore with NCC's Affordable Housing Officer what action we might take to provide for this need.

Scam Phone Calls & Emails

The PC has been contacted by a local resident concerned at the high levels of scam phone calls and emails that he and other people in the area are receiving. There are ways of reducing these problem contacts, and advice is published elsewhere in this issue of the Column.

Potholes within the Parish

Over £1,000,000 extra funding has been awarded to NCC to address pothole issues within the County. Potholes and damaged roads can be reported to NCC on **0345 600 6400**.

Bus Service on Wednesdays

Information on the Wednesday bus service operating from Longframlington through Swarland, Percy Wood Caravan Park, NotM to Alnwick, is displayed on parish notice boards and on the PC website. The service is being operated at no cost to the PC, allows a few hours for shopping, visiting etc. You don't have to pre-book, and concessionary passes are accepted. Please do make a point of using this service (See bus times and stopping points elsewhere in The Column.).

Try 1572

BT has recently set up a scheme to ward off unwanted cold calls. We all get them - the recorded message claiming to represent a government initiative to offer us a new boiler, upgrade our insulation or double glazing, or to check whether we're eligible to claim some domestic improvement if we're on benefits. If you hear the call through and press the suggested number to unsubscribe, chances are you're actually ensuring you get other similar calls. More dangerous however are the calls made by an actual person, telling you for example you've won a cash prize or are entitled to a refund, or claiming to be your bank and wanting to recover an overpayment into your account. The caller may know quite a lot about you, but still wants you to confirm your full account details so that they can pay money into your account or blatantly withdraw some in the case of an overpayment scam. Whatever their claims, if you provide your account details these will be used to remove money from your account. Never give your bank account and personal details to a cold caller, whoever they claim to be. Banks insist that they never ask for such information over the phone.

The new BT service (maybe there are equivalents for non-BT customers?) involves dialling 1572 immediately after receiving and ending a nuisance call - which you have to have answered - and following the menu provided. Access to your phone will then be blocked for that number. You may find you still receive some further calls, as many of the callers regularly change their 'number', but over a period your nuisance calls should reduce.

To use this 1572 service you first need to go to the BT website and follow the procedure to set it up for your phone number.

If you do receive any doubtful calls, if you can get the caller's details, report the possible scam to Action Fraud by calling 0300 123 2040 / textphone 0300 123 2050. Ed

Disappearance of Swarland's Trees

One of the features of Swarland that has made it different from many of the other rural communities in Northumberland is its high level of tree cover, much of which is supposed to be covered by Tree Protection Orders and thus should be here for future residents to continue to enjoy.

Of late there has sadly been a massive increase in the number of trees removed right across the parish. Some of these will have been necessary for health and safety reasons, but many of them seem to be largely for cosmetic reasons, a desire to reduce effort to maintain an area or because a tree (which may have been there for many years) is considered to be a threat to a house recently built that is too close to the existing tree.

Trees die and / or may need to be removed but it is vital that **every** tree that is removed is replaced, with an equivalent species, nearby or elsewhere in the parish in order to help keep our parish one in which it is pleasant and safe to live.

Vyner Park Update

You'll notice some tree works (crown reduction and removal of dead wood) taking place on Vyner Park before the end of March. Quotes are currently being obtained from tree surgeons and the work will go ahead when practicable. Notice will be given of the necessary temporary path closures.

We've finalised the Vyner Park Charity budget for 2017-18, and have slightly reduced our precept request. However, the aim at this stage is to build up a financial reserve to cover big items of expenditure such as repainting the tennis courts and having the vegetation on the grassland properly cut, baled and removed next year. In conjunction with possibly planting fruit trees on the driest area of this field (see elsewhere re a survey), proper management of the grassland will improve its viability as a wild flower meadow. The Northumberland Wildlife Trust officer who inspected the park last year was impressed with the number of species already present.

In the warmer weather (remember that?), you'll be able to use the rear patio at Nelson's, as the safety fence and additional paying are now in place, paid for by a grant.

Order yourselves a glass of wine and a sandwich, hire some bowls, and enjoy a pleasant couple of hours!
